BIOL 390, Independent Investigations, provides infrastructure for Biology majors and minors who wish to earn course credit for conducting research and satisfy the College of Arts and Sciences Experiential Learning Course requirement. Students must first identify an HU faculty member who is actively conducting research and willing to serve as their research mentor. The research mentor and student will develop a research project that can be completed in one semester. During the semester, students must submit a mentor-approved research proposal and perform the research. At the end of the semester, they must submit a final written report. The course instructor grades submissions and works with your research mentor to report a final grade. With research mentor approval, senior Biology majors may submit their final written report for consideration as a Capstone project in lieu of the Senior Comprehensive Exam (Senior Summative Assessment).
